# **Lance Corporal James Jackson Brown**

Service No - 26504,  
Regiment - King's Shropshire Light Infantry.  
7<sup>th</sup> Battalion.

Died of wounds in France

Died on - 29 September 1918. Age 23

Buried at Sunken Road Cemetery,  
Boisleux-St. Marc, France. Grave III. B. 8.

In 1914 they were living at Brook House Pant, Llanymynech Shropshire. On the 1911 Census they were living at 23, Lisburn Road, Liverpool James was an apprentice butcher and his Father Edward was a Police Constable. His father was born in Aberhafesp, Montgomeryshire.

Killed in action in France

Died on 25 April 1917. Age 29

Remembered on Arras Memorial, France.

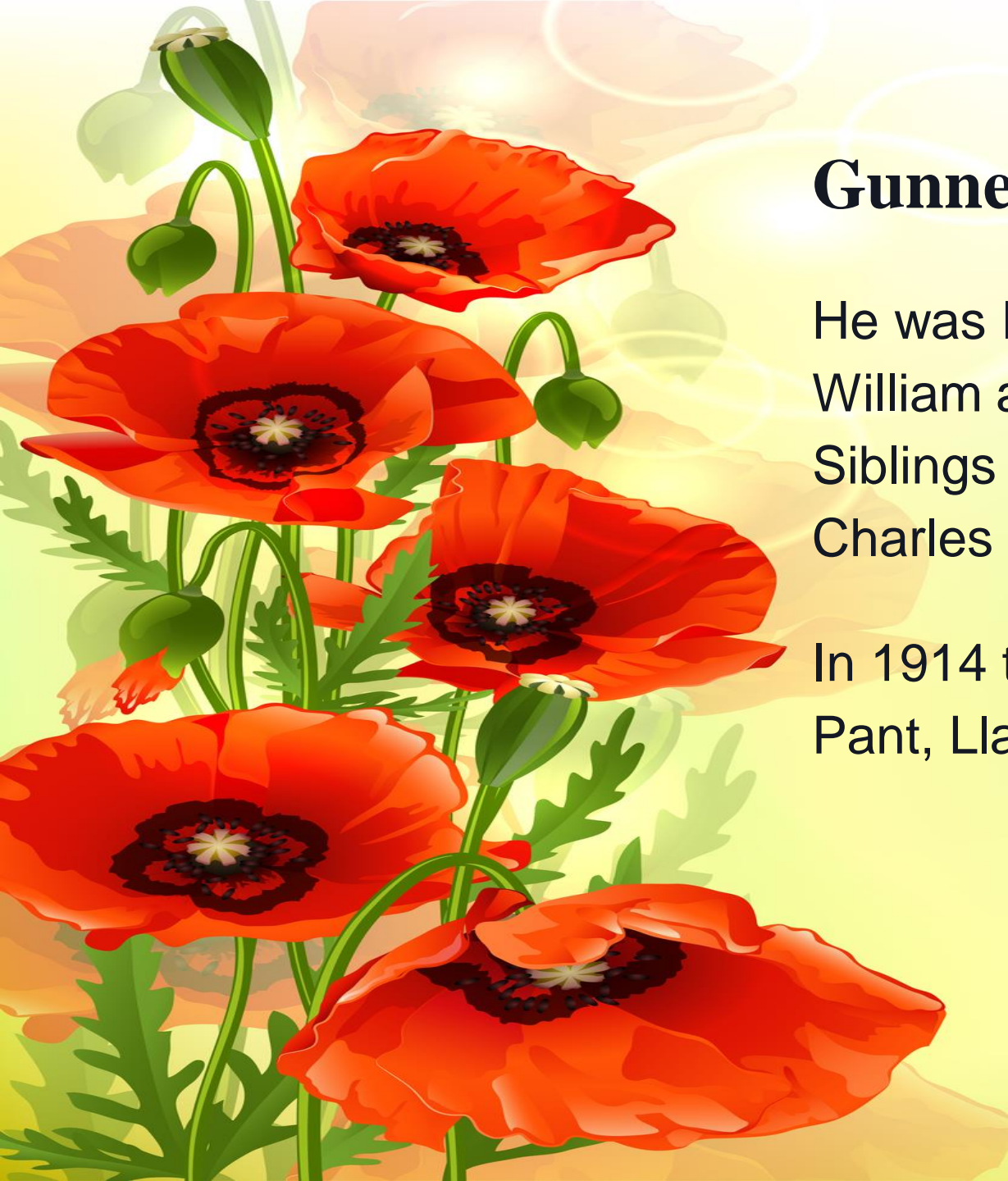
# **Gunner John Herbert Humphreys**

Service Number 291840

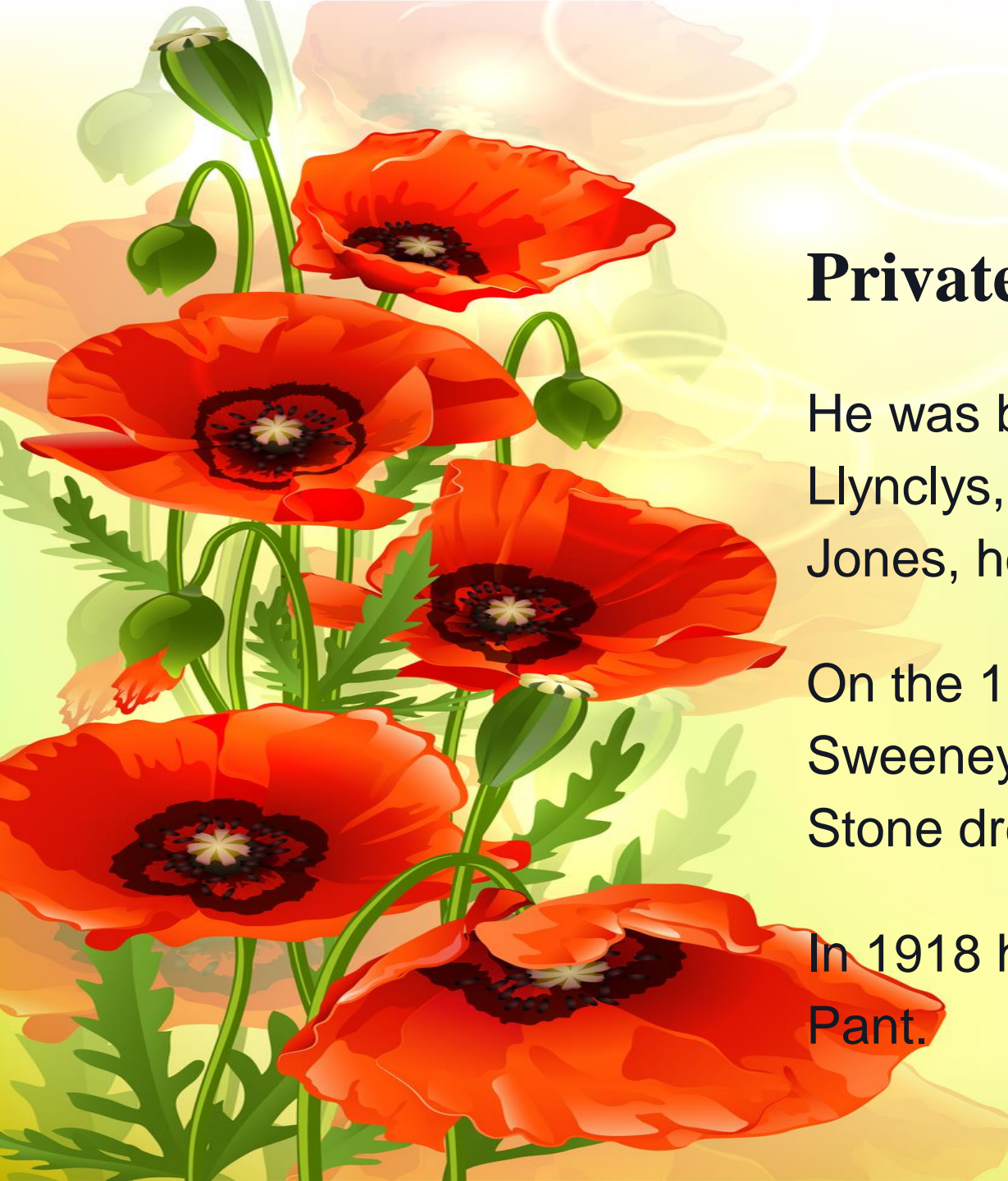
15th Bn. Welsh Regiment.

Churchyard, England.

He was born in 1901 at Upper House, Pant, Llanymynech Shropshire. His parents were Joseph and Elizabeth Jones, he had 6 brothers John, Harry, Harvey, Roger, Robert and Edward. His half - brother Robert also died as a result of the great war.



## **Sergeant William Edward Jones**

Service Number – 202810

1st/4th Bn. King's Shropshire Light Infantry.

Killed in action in Belgium  
on 31 October 1917. Age 27

Buried at St. Julien Dressing Station  
Cemetery, Belgium. Grave III. B. 11.



## **Sergeant William Edward Jones**

He was born in 1890 Llanymynech, parents were John and Mary Ann Jones, and he had 6 siblings Agnes, George Amelia, John, Harry and Arthur. On the 1911 Census his family were living at 3, Bradford Terrace, Llanymynech Shropshire where his father was a saddler and harness maker.



## **Private Thomas Lloyd**

Service Number 9893,  
1st Bn. King's Shropshire Light Infantry.

Killed in action in Belgium  
on 22 October 1914. Age 20

Remembered on Ploegsteert Memorial,  
Belgium. Panel 8.





## **Private Thomas Lloyd**

He was born in Wolverhampton to Thomas and Emma Lloyd and later moved to Cockshutt Ellesmere, in 1914 he was a lodger with Mr and Mrs Saddler at Railway Cottage, Pant.



# **Captain Roland Octavius Logan**

5th Bn. Oxford and Bucks Light Infantry.

Killed in action in Belgium  
on 17th October 1915. Age 33

Buried at Birr Cross Roads Cemetery,  
Belgium. Grave III. A. 21.



## **Captain Roland Octavius Logan**

He was born in 1882 in Chester, his parents were Edward and Emily Logan and he had a sister Isabelle who married Jasper Moon of Red House, Penyfoel, Llanymynech he also had a brother who served in the war.

On the 1911 Census his mother Emily was living briefly at Llywnygroes Llanymynech with his sister and brother in law.

In 1914 his mother was living at Great Ness Hall Great Ness, Shrewsbury.

He also had a brother called Edward Townshend Logan whose memorial is in Chester.

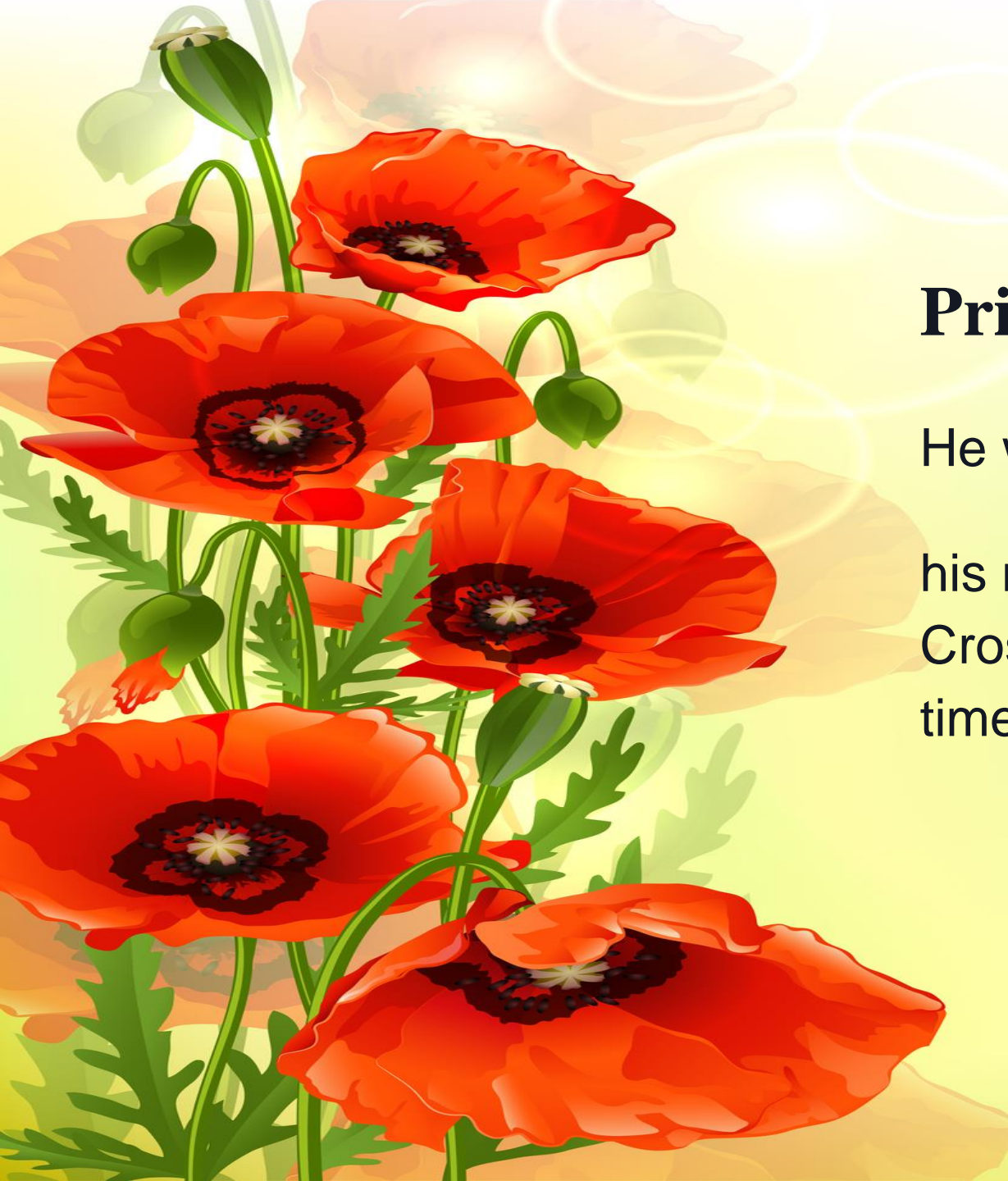


# **Private Richard John Morgan**

## **Major John Morris MC**

Royal Army Medical Corps. Attached to

Killed in action in France  
on 7<sup>th</sup> October 1918

Buried at Bellicourt British Cemetery,  
France. Grave II. K. 7.



## **Major John Morris MC,**

Born in Llansilin in 1879 he later moved with his family to Pentref, Carreghofa.

After his medical training he moved to Hyde in Cheshire with his wife and two children. He was a surgeon and worked along side the police.



## **Private Robert Owen**

Service number 290108,  
1st/7th Bn. Royal Welsh Fusiliers.

Killed in action in Palestine  
on 26 March 1917. Age 24

Buried at Gaza War Cemetery, Israel.  
Grave II. C. 8.

He was born in 1893 at The High Penyfoel and later lived at Yates Cottage Pant, Llanymynech Shropshire. His parents were Albert and Caroline Owen and he had 6 siblings Margaret, Ellen, Fred, Charlie, Mary and Herbert

Service number 16317

7th Bn. King's Shropshire Light Infantry.

Killed in action in France  
on 13 November 1916. Age 23

Remembered on Thiepval Memorial,  
France. Pier and Face 12 A and 12 D.



## **Private William Peate**

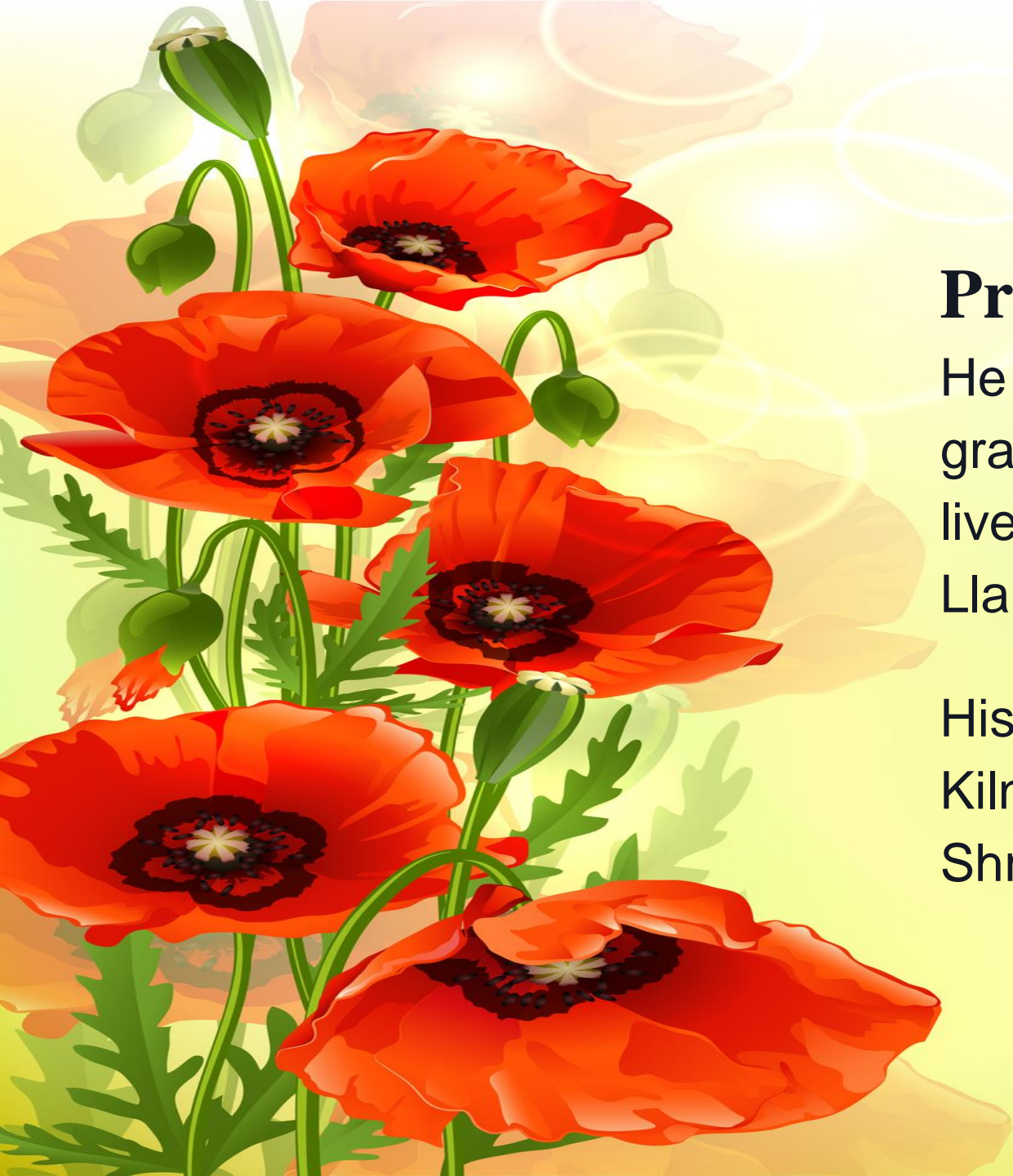

Died in Salonika on 8 May 1918. Age 27

Buried at Salonika (Lembet Road) Military  
Cemetery, Greece. Grave 1405.

He was born in 1891 living with his grandparents John and Ann Owen who lived at the Wern, Carreghofa, Llanymynech, Montgomeryshire.

His father was living as a servant at Malt Kiln Cottage, Waen Wen, Crickheath, Shropshire.

145th Siege Bty. Royal Garrison  
Artillery.

Killed in action in Belgium  
on 2 September 1917 Age 36

Buried at Bleuet Farm Cemetery,  
Belgium. Grave I. H. 11.

In 1911 he was married to Margaret and they had 2 children Arthur and Phyllis they were living at 1 Greenwich Cottage, Pant, Llanymynech Shropshire, his occupation at this time was a bricklayer.

Service Number 116963

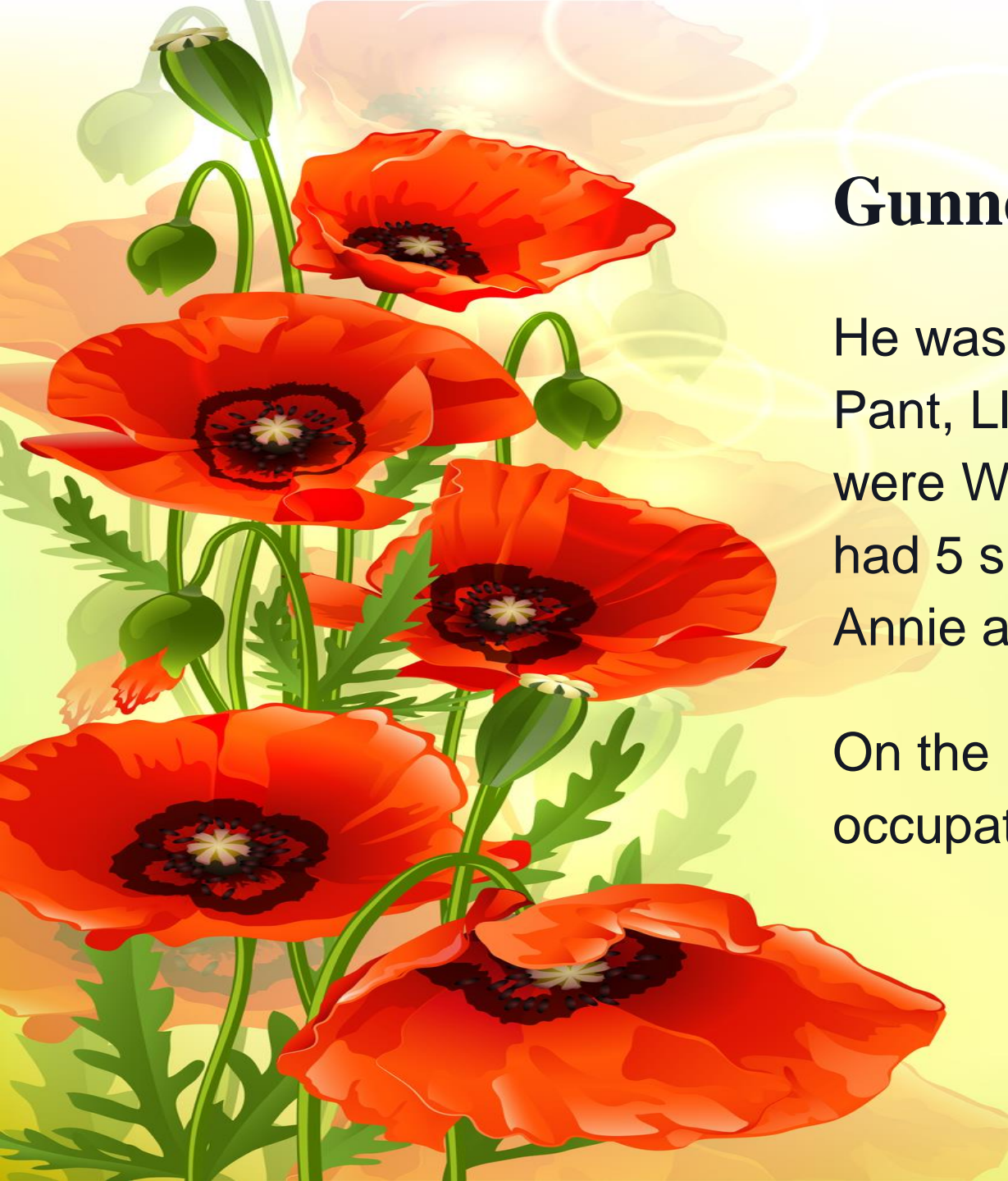
251st Bde. "C" Bty. Royal Field Artillery.

On the 1911 Census it stated his occupation was a limestone quarryman

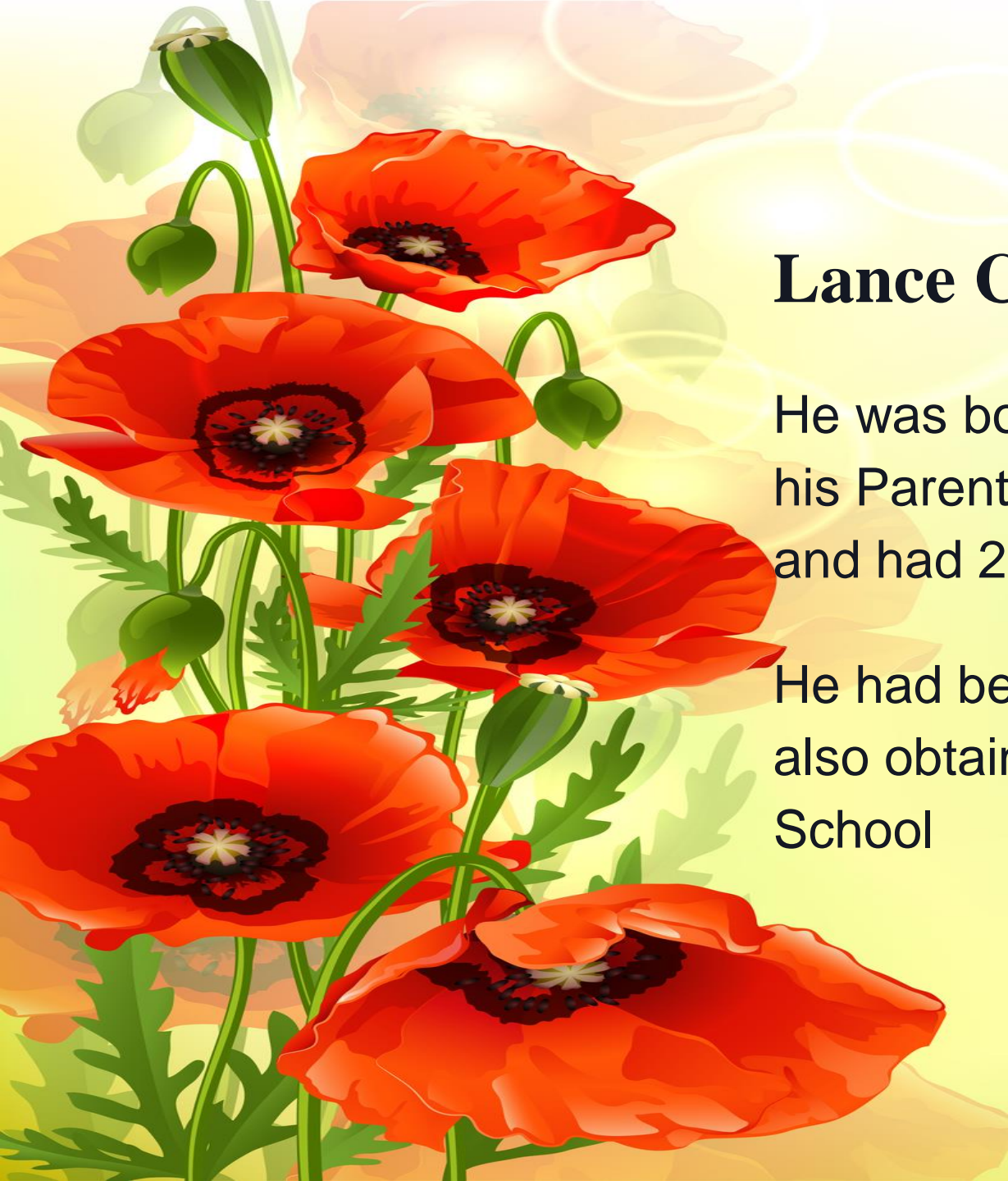


## **Lance Corporal James Louis Spencer**

Killed in action in France  
on 30 March 1918. Age 21

Buried at Bucquoy Road Cemetery, Ficheux,  
France. Grave VI. G. 11.

He had been a member of the Church Choir and had also obtained a scholarship for Llanfyllin Grammar School



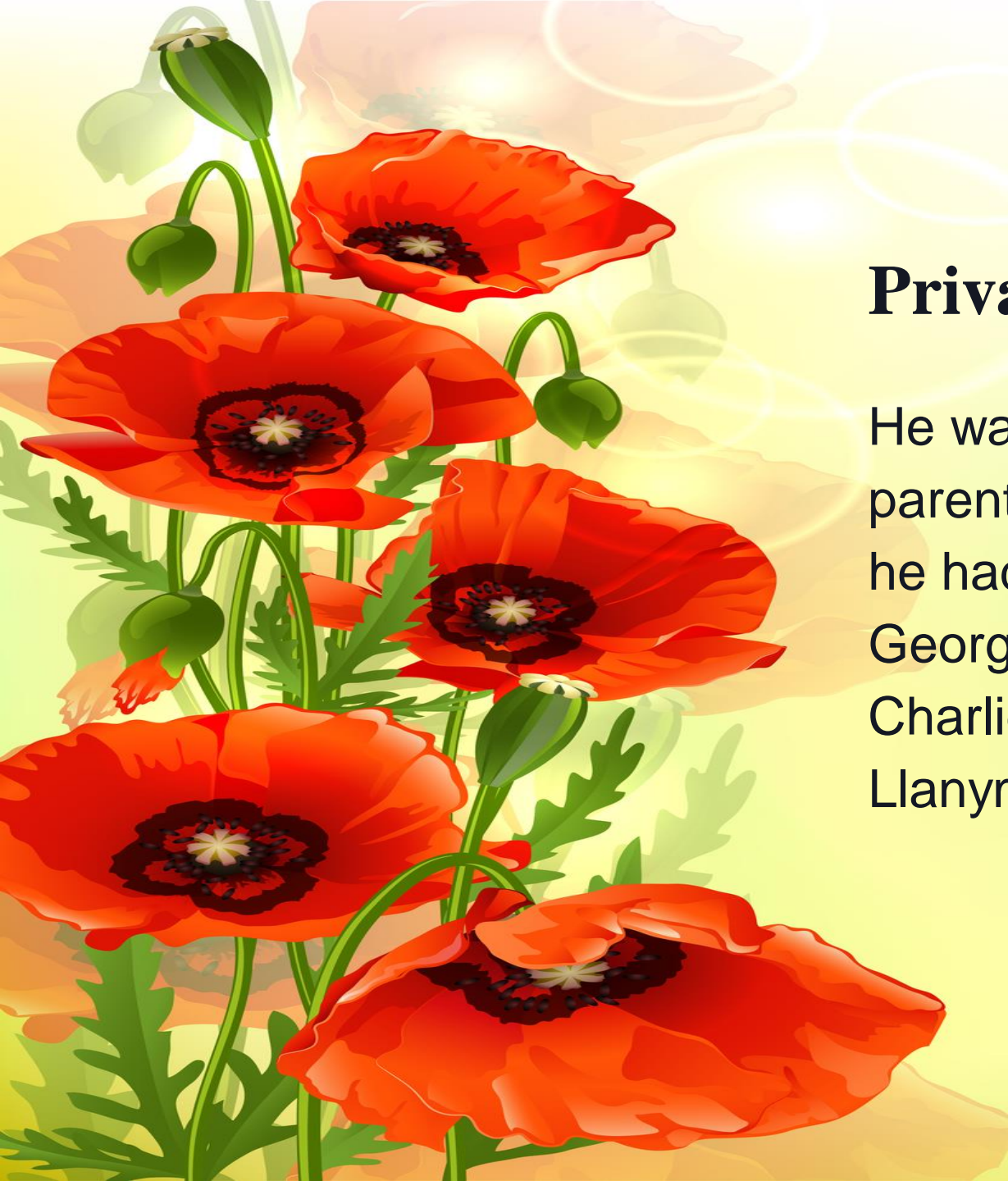
## **Private Albert Thomas**

Service Number - 1158,  
7th Bn. Royal Welsh Fusiliers.

Killed in action in Gallipoli  
on 10 August 1915. Aged 23

Remembered on Helles Memorial, Turkey. Panel  
77 to 80.



## **Private Maurice Richard Williams**

He was born in 1892 at Knockin Shropshire, his parents were Richard and Florence Annie Williams, Florence later married after the death of her husband to Arthur William Reed..

On the 1911 Census they were living at 3, Ashfield Terraces Llanymynech. Maurice's occupation was listed as a railway clerk.



## **Private Robert Jones**

Service Number - 15062,  
1st Bn. King's Shropshire Light Infantry

Discharged on medical grounds in 1916 then died  
at home on 10<sup>th</sup> November 1918

Buried at Llanymynech (St. Agatha) Churchyard,  
England.

Robert is not mentioned on the War Memorial

England.

He was born in 1898 at Temperance House, Llanymynech Shropshire which was behind the Cross Keys. His mother Lucy Jeffreys was informed of his death.
